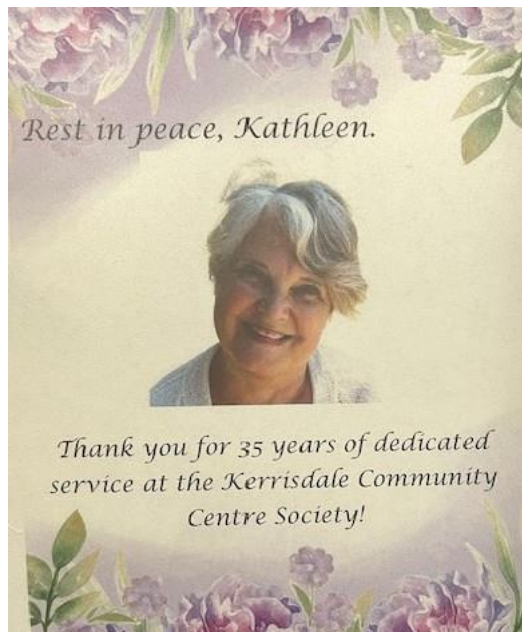

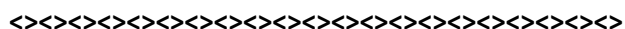

### **Feb 1 How to lose a guy in 10 days (2003)**

An advice columnist, Andie Anderson, tries pushing the boundaries of what she can write about in her new piece about how to get a man to leave you in 10 days. Her editor, Lana loves it, and Andie goes off to find a man she can use for the experiment. Enter executive Ben Berry, who is so confident in his romantic prowess that he thinks he can make any woman fall in love with him in 10 days. When Andie and Ben meet, their plans backfire.

### **Feb 7 & 8 The Terminal (2004)**

Victor Navorski (played by Tom Hanks), a man from the Eastern European nation of Krakozhia, flies into JFK airport. At Customs he is forbidden entry to the USA - Krakozhia has been taken over in a coup and the US does not currently recognize the new regime, or nation. In addition, the borders of Krakozhia are now closed. This leaves Victor in limbo - he cannot enter the US or go back to Krakozhia. While waiting for the diplomatic situation to sort itself out he is forced to live in the International Transit section of JFK, living off his own resourcefulness. He also makes some new friends along the way.

### **Feb 14 & 15 Night at the Museum Smithsonian (2009)**

A night guard of the Museum of Natural History must travel to the Smithsonian Museum in order to help the exhibits that have been sent there. With new allies, he must do it while a new enemy returns to gain power over all of them. He must do everything that he possibly can before time runs out.

### **Feb 21 & 22 Night at the Museum Secret Tomb (2014)**

In the film, security guard Larry Daley must travel to London to return the Tablet of Ahkmenrah, an Egyptian artifact which causes the exhibits to come to life, before the magic disappears.

### **Feb 28 Eternal Sunshine of the Spotless Mind (2004)**

is a surreal romantic drama about Joel Barish (Jim Carrey) and Clementine Kruczynski (Kate Winslet), a couple who undergo a procedure to erase each other from their memories after a painful breakup. As Joel re-experiences their relationship in reverse while it is being wiped, he realizes he still loves her and tries to hide her in his subconscious.

**HOW PINK SHIRT DAY BEGAN**

In 2007, after a new student at their Nova Scotia school was bullied for wearing a pink shirt, two Grade Twelve students – David Shepherd and Travis Price – bought 50 pink shirts and encouraged their classmates to wear pink shirts to send a strong message against bullying and homophobia.

The next day they went to distribute the shirts and to their surprise the majority of students arrived wearing pink.

This random act of kindness began a global movement

The International Day of Pink was declared by the UNITED NATIONS in 2012 to bring awareness to and to emphasize Anti-Bullying.

Bullying can occur in any age group or stage of life and in any social, familial, or work situation. On Pink Shirt Day, people worldwide wear pink to discourage bullying behaviours and to encourage kindness.

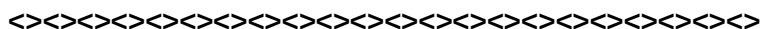

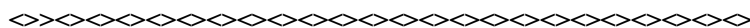
